

Chair Of The board, Eric Mitchell Stepping Down

Eric Mitchell has announced that he is stepping down as an Upmo Trustee and Chair of the Board. Eric became a Trustee in January 2017 and has served as Chair since May that year. With Eric's background within the Care sector, he has provided a wealth of experience to the growth and development of Upmo. Eric was heavily involved in 2020 when the Covid pandemic saw services to students suspended and the introduction of Upmo Connect to maintain online support to students and families during this challenging time. Eric's knowledge of the sector and his commitment to Upmo and our students will be sorely missed. There will be more thought given over the coming weeks to how Upmo will celebrate Eric's service to Upmo. In the meantime, Upmo Trustees have begun process of recruiting a new Chair and have engaged consultants Bruce Tait Associates to identify and assist in the appointment of a new Chair. Further announcements will be made in due course.



New Upmo 3 Year Strategy

In 2024, we embark on a significant milestone, marking the commencement of the implementation of a new three-year strategy that will guide us through to 2026. The Senior Leadership Team have prepared an extensive strategy which has been put to the Upmo Board with Trustee comments expected back by the end of January. 
Faith Nicholson, Funding and Grants Officer, is moving on

Digital Multimedia Workshops

Since august 2023, Upmo Connect have been developing and delivering a year-long programme of Digital Multimedia workshops, giving participating students the opportunity to learn about film production, sound-design, animation, and music for film. Sessions have been designed in such a way that they are supported through interactive web-content such as online videos, animations and learning aids.

Our team are experimenting with ways that digitally provided content could facilitate self-directed study which not only benefits students attending Upmo, on-site as usual, but also can benefit students who are challenged geographically or simply cannot attend Upmo in person as often as they'd like. Designing workshops in this ways gives a lot of flexibility and allows students in different situations to benefit the same quality of learning in a way that suits their needs.
